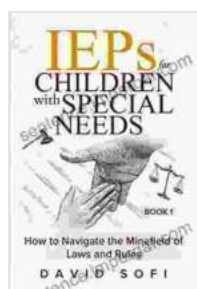

Referral - May be done by any person, including parents and professionals, including general education teachers. Referral is not a request.

Consent - Written permission from the parent/guardian is required for the school to conduct an evaluation.

Evaluations - In all areas related to suspected disability. Parent evaluation is not required unless requested by parent. Evaluations must be completed within 30 school days of the parent's written consent. Parents have the right to receive all evaluations 10 days prior to the TEAM meeting. Parents must request in writing for school for reports to be received in advance of the meeting. Reevaluations are held every 3 years.

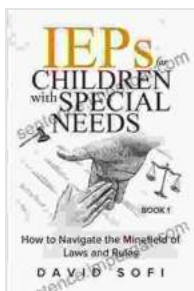
IEP Meeting - School must notify parents in writing 15 days prior to the IEP meeting. Parents must be invited to the IEP meeting. The IEP team must include the parent/guardian, at least one general education teacher, at least one special education teacher, and at least one representative of the school district who is qualified to provide or supervise the provision of specially designed instruction.

IEP To Parents - School must provide a copy of the IEP to the parent/guardian within 10 days of the IEP meeting. The IEP must be written in understandable language.

Parent Response - Parents have the right to disagree with the IEP team's decision. Parents may request a hearing to resolve the dispute. Parents may also request a mediation to resolve the dispute.

Annual IEP - The IEP must be reviewed and updated annually.

Progress Reports - The IEP team must report on the child's progress towards the IEP goals.



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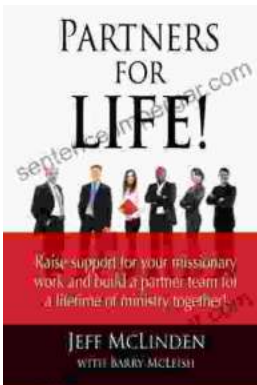
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
