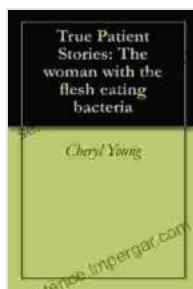

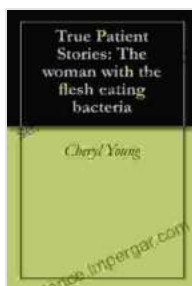
- Redness and swelling at the site of an injury
